# Engaging Culture with the Character of God 9 AM Bible Study, Jan – Mar 2024

### **Class Purpose Statement:**

This class aims to equip people to consistently interpret culture through the lens of God's character so they can be ambassadors for God, influencing those around them with God's heart.

## Week 1: Why Engage Culture at all?

- 1. Class Intro & Information
  - a. Intro/format/ expectations
  - b. Read the passage assigned to your table and then develop a list of characteristics and/or uses of the element (salt or light) Jesus references in that scripture. You can use this space for notes from your discussion and ideas from other tables.
    - i. Passages: <u>Matthew 5:13-16</u>, <u>Luke 14:34-35</u>, <u>Philippians 2:14-16</u>, <u>Mark 9:50</u>, Mark 4:21: Luke 8:16-18
    - ii. Characteristics of SALT

iii. Characteristics of LIGHT

- 2. Understanding
  - a. Characteristic of God: He is present and actively engaged.
  - b. Command from God (to followers): His church should be the same (salt & light).



### 3. Application

Our goal is to understand the character of God so we can:

- a. Authentically reflect it to the people around us
- b. Introduce people to it so they may consider His principles and alternatives
- **c.** We will **apply** God's character to a controversial cultural topic to learn more about His character and communicate the view He takes regarding the topic and why.
- **d.** Our premise is that God always has a better alternative to whatever culture wants to pursue. What He invites us into is of far greater value (now & eternally) than any of the 'cunning and craftiness of <culture> in their deceitful scheming".

# 4. Assignment

- a. Each week, you will receive scriptures to read.
- **b.** After reading them, make observations about God's Character. Write them down on the current week's sheet & bring them the following week. (Build a library)
- **c.** *After making your own observations*, feel free to consult other resources (Study notes, commentaries, etc) to deepen your understanding of God's character.
- d. Homework: Read <u>Romans 1</u>, <u>Romans 2:12–15</u> and <u>Ephesians 4:20–24</u> What do you observe about God's Character in these passages?
