3. Application

Remember: *This class aims to equip us to consistently interpret culture through the lens of God’s character so we can be ambassadors for God, influencing those around us with God’s heart.*

How do we engage the culture around us with God’s heart?

- a. It is always better for everyone that there is objective moral truth. Everyone bases their life on this premise, the difference being that some don’t admit/acknowledge they do.
- b. Our premise is that God always has a better alternative to whatever culture wants to pursue. What He invites us into is of far greater value (now & eternally) than any of the ‘cunning and craftiness of <culture> in their deceitful scheming”.
